The Department of Psychology and Education at Mount Holyoke College conducts a limited graduate program for persons interested in pursuing a Master of Arts degree in Psychology. The Department has a strong research orientation with opportunities for study in the following areas of psychology: learning and comparative, physiological, sensation and perception, cognitive, social, developmental, and educational. (Please note that we do not offer clinical training.) Students may also enroll in the graduate courses offered at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst.

It is the policy of our department to accept only those graduate students whom we can fund through graduate assistantships. Graduate assistants receive a tuition waiver and a stipend of \$11,000/year. In exchange, they are required to devote 20 hours/week to teaching in one of our core courses (usually, experimental methods or statistics). Demonstrated proficiency with the English language (reading, speaking and writing) is therefore critical, and constitutes an important criterion for admission. Also, acceptance into the program is contingent upon the willingness of at least one faculty member to sponsor the student's research and serve as their academic and research advisor.
