- Students will identify characteristic features of the visual arts of world civilizations such as ancient Egypt, Greece, Rome (Standard 8.2)
- Students will describe the purposes for which works were created and interpret their meanings (Standard 6 Purposes and Meanings)
- Students will describe the role of Pharaoh; the beliefs about death, the afterlife, mummification; the roles of different deities; and the important achievements of Egyptian civilization (7.14-7.16)
- Students will describe the contributions of Roman civilization (7.43)
- Students will discuss and identify the major accomplishments and the cultural life of the ancient Greeks (7.32-7.34)
- Students will identify the stylistic features of a work and explain how it relates to aesthetic tradition and historical or cultural contexts (8.8)
