COURSE REQUIREMENTS (Anforderungen):

In addition to four weekly class meetings, students are **required** to attend a weekly conversation lab ("Live Lab") led by Maria Zywietz, our language assistant from the University of Leipzig. Sign-up sheets will be circulated in class and then hung on the bulletin board next to the German Studies Department (Ciruti 103). Check there to see where lab sections are meeting. Labs will begin the week of February 16th!

Approximately every two weeks there will be a quiz on two chapters of the textbook (based on the material covered in class, written homework and later on readings). In addition, there will be several Vokabelquizzes on the vocabulary in the book and in the readings. The average grade on all the vocabulary quizzes will count as ONE quiz. There will also be a MIDTERM and a FINAL EXAM. **NOTE: the lowest quiz grade will be dropped, but the MIDTERM and FINAL exam will be counted!**

You have an opportunity to submit the online Web Search Activities, except for the first one, for EXTRA CREDIT (each counts as ONE homework assignment). They are linked to the online syllabus and available on the class web site.

Dictations that correspond to chapters in *Neue Horizonte* will also be part of the workbook homework assignment each chapter. The entire audio program is available online. There will be two essays assigned --**to be written in German**-- on topics related to the two books, *Das doppelte Lottchen* and *Die Weiße Rose*. You will have an opportunity to revise the two essays. The grades on the first and last draft will be averaged and the average grade recorded.

Regular class attendance is required! Students are expected to participate regularly (in class and in the conversation lab or "Live Lab") and to hand in homework **ON TIME!**
