Timeline of Important Dates

This timeline will help you anticipate deadlines and procedures related to your return to Mount Holyoke.

October

- The [Residential Life Office](#) e-mails students returning in the spring with information about housing.
- Senior portraits for the yearbook are taken in the fall, and are due to the Llamarada Yearbook staff by the end of October. If you will be away in the fall of your senior year, you may have your photo taken in the previous spring, or you may submit a high-quality digital image; see the [Llamarada](#) website for details.

November

- The Registrar's Office e-mails students with pre-registration information for the spring. You will not need to be cleared by your academic adviser to pre-register, but be sure to consult your adviser either before you pre-register or upon your return. Students may not pre-register from abroad for Five-College courses, but can access information on course offerings and calendars through the [Five College course catalog](#).

December

- [Student Financial Services](#) issues tuition bills for the spring semester.

February

- The [Residential Life Office](#) e-mails students returning in the fall with information about how to participate in the housing lottery.
- Information on All Campus Elections (including Class Board leaders and SGA Executive Board positions) will become available in mid to late February. Contact sga@mtholyoke.edu or a Class Board representative for details. Candidates running from abroad need to have a "Proxy" (a student to represent them on campus, to attend required meetings in March and April, etc.).
- The [Universal Application](#) for Mount Holyoke Summer Research Fellowships and Internships is generally due in February or early March for projects in the coming summer. Students applying from abroad have been successful in the competitions in past years, so it is definitely worth applying even if you will not be back here for spring.

March

- Applications for some of the more competitive student employment positions (such as Administrative Fellows and SAW mentors and assistants) are generally due in March. Contact the [Career Development Center](#) for details.

April

- The [Registrar's Office](#) e-mails students with pre-registration information for the fall. You will not need to be cleared by your academic adviser to pre-register, but be sure to consult your adviser either before you pre-register or upon your return. Students may not pre-register from abroad for Five-College courses, but can access information on course offerings and calendars through the [Five College course catalog](#).
- The All Campus Elections Committee will e-mail students with information about how to vote from abroad in All Campus Elections.

July

- [Student Financial Services](#) issues tuition bills for the fall semester.

Note also:

- Many of the national fellowships for graduate study abroad (Fulbright, Rhodes, Marshall, etc.) have deadlines early in the fall of senior year. Be in touch with the Career Development Center in the summer after your junior year if you are interested in applying as a senior for any of these awards.
- In some years, the College has limited the number of students who may hold parking passes for their cars; see the Parking Office web site for information on changes and restrictions that may apply upon your return.
- Caps and gowns for senior year are typically ordered in the spring of junior year. You may order yours from abroad by contacting the Campus Store; they will need your height and hat size.
