Am I in a priority/ high risk group?

Center for Disease Control current priority groups include:

Pregnant women

Persons who live with or provide care for infants aged

<6 months

(e.g., parents, siblings, and daycare providers)

Persons age 64 and under who have medical conditions that put them at higher risk for influenza-related complications

These conditions include:

Asthma:

those students currently using controlling medications such as Flovent, Advair, Pulmicort, Azmacort, Symbicort, Singulair, Aerobid, Vanceril, Serevent, Accolate, Qvar, and Zflo. Albuterol and Atrovent are not controller medicines

Severe, Chronic Illnesses

such as diabetes, cystic fibrosis, leukemia, seizures, heart disease, ulcerative colitis, Crohn's disease, neuromuscular disease

Weakened Immune System

due to disease or medication (such as people with HIV or AIDS or cancer, or those on chronic steroids or other immunosuppressive medications)

Nasal Spray Vaccine Eligibility

- under 50 years old
- not pregnant
- no high risk conditions (see above)
- not in contact with a person with a severely weakened immune system
- healthy at time of administration
