# WHAT DOES PUBLIC SAFETY DO?

---

## ESCORT SERVICES

---

Medical Transportation: If you have a temporary or permanent disability, consult the Health Center who can issue a Ride Card which authorizes Public Safety to transport you for classes. Please note that Public Safety calls for emergencies take precedence over rides, and at times this service may be delayed or unavailable. We do our best to provide as prompt service as possible

Public Safety will provide escorts to students who are traveling alone via foot, bicycle, or cruiser patrol from campus parking lots or academic buildings to your residence hall from **12:30 am until 6:00 am**. In order to maintain patrol and incident response levels, transportation will not be provided from one residence hall to another.

## LOCKOUT SERVICES

---

Residence Halls: If you can not locate your hall staff, Public Safety can provide lockout services. There is a \$10 charge for this service which is placed on your general bill.

Motor Vehicles: Public Safety has some tools to aide in accessing your vehicle if you lock your keys in. Note that we are unable to access the trunk; a locksmith should be called for such services.

Note that the department can also jump start dead batteries on vehicles. Call us at x2304 for assistance.

## PARKING

---

Please note that there have been several changes to the parking system, some due to construction and some to begin work on the campus master plan.

**New Student Lots:** The rear of Gorse lot opened in 2001 providing more than 50 new spaces. In addition, the Ham/MacGregor lot was rebuilt last year adding approximately 70 student parking spaces to the system this year. The Mary Lyon Lot has additional student spaces.

**New Employee Lot:** Last year an employee lot was built on Jewett Lane. The Torrey Lot will reopen this fall for faculty/staff parking.

**Student Lot Closures:** The Prospect Lot no longer has student spaces.

Please consult the new Parking Map mailed to all students this fall for an updated view of campus lots.

## BICYCLE REGISTRATION

---

All bicycles parked on campus must be registered with Public Safety. On occasion, unregistered bicycles are cleared from the bicycle storage rooms in order to make room for new bicycles.
