

Guidelines for writing up homework solutions

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One skill that we will work on developing is the ability to clearly and effectively communicate mathematical ideas. To help you develop this skill, I am asking that please you turn in your written homework following these guidelines. This will also help with giving you better feedback on your work.

- Your handwriting should be legible.
- Homework with multiple pages should be stapled in the upper left-hand corner.
- In the upper right-hand corner of the first page, you should write the following information:
 - Your name
 - Your class and section number (ie. Math 211-01)
 - The homework set number (ie. Homework 1)
 - The due date of the homework
- Each solution should first begin with the original problem statement.
- Problems should be numbered on the left side of the page.
- Problems should be written in the order assigned.
- Leave a visible separation between problems.
- Leave the top of each page and margins blank for scoring and feedback.
- It is good practice to first work out the solution on scratch paper, and then neatly write up your solutions.

My goal in providing these guidelines is for you to turn in neat, complete assignments that are easy to read, self-contained, and can be looked back upon as study tools.
