QUESTIONS TO BE ADDRESSED IN THE LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION FOR THE CHURCHILL SCHOLARSHIP

Your letter of recommendation will be read by the entire Selection Committee, which is composed of former Churchill Scholars, who are, for the most part, academic scientists in a variety of fields. There is always a mathematician, a physicist, a chemist, an engineer, and two different kinds of biologist. Thank you again for your assistance in the selection of Churchill Scholars.

- (1) How long have you known the applicant? In what capacity?
- (2) Please comment in detail on the applicant's academic work in the sciences, engineering, or mathematics. If relevant, please comment on his or her research in the laboratory or elsewhere. How has that work demonstrated the applicant's intellectual leadership, creativity, and dedication? It is not necessary to repeat information already included in the student's transcript or application (e.g., grades and awards), unless you consider something particularly noteworthy.
- (3) How does the applicant rank when compared to other recent students in your department or laboratory and with others students who have won major postgraduate scholarships? How would you rank the applicant in overall ability and achievement among the students you have taught or directed in research? Those who review the applications for the Churchill Scholarship have found this ranking to be exceptionally important. It is common for those writing letters of recommendation to state that the applicant is the best or among the very best students the writer has had, so it is useful to have concrete examples and the particular rationale for your high regard.
- (4) Please comment on the applicant's personal qualities. How do you think he or she will adjust to the challenges of a new and very different academic and social setting? The Churchill Foundation does not necessarily seek so-called "well rounded" applicants and has a penchant for people with "interesting jagged edges" who show promise of becoming leaders in their chosen fields. Churchill Scholars are known not solely for their outstanding academic achievements but also for their contributions to the intellectual, athletic, dramatic, musical, and social life at Churchill College and at the University of Cambridge. How would the applicant represent your institution, the Churchill Foundation, and the United States?
